Spotlight on St. Croix



HISTORY

Discovered by Christopher Columbus in 1493, St. Croix's most prominent landmarks are the sugar-mill ruins, reminding visitors of the time when sugarcane was "king" and the island was divided into hundreds of plantations. Homes, resort swimming pools and hotels have been built around many of these ruins, which are valued symbols of St. Croix's rich history.

Other reminders of the island's past are the fanciful names used to identify St. Croix locations. "Jealousy," "Wheel of Fortune" and "Lower Love" are all plantation names dating from the 1760s, when land was divided into low-priced 150-acre tracts used by the Danes to attract settlers. One can only speculate as to the planters' original intentions, but the names endure and are still used to identify every land transaction that takes place. St. Croix has been ruled by seven nations, all of which left enduring marks on the island. Though it is currently an American territory (seemingly reminiscent of the United States with its shopping centers and fast-food restaurants) St. Croix has preserved its West Indian cultural heritage, attitudes and identity. Families who have resided here for 10 generations are still influential, their roots stretching back to the colonial era.

The island's recent history is filled with stories of survival and renaissance. When Hurricane Hugo passed over the island in September 1989, it wreaked havoc on buildings and vegetation. While evidence of the devastation can still be seen, the island's residents, with considerable outside assistance, are working hard to make St. Croix, once again, the jewel of the Caribbean.

DOCKING

The ship docks in Frederiksted, St. Croix.

TRANSPORTATION

Roundtrip transportation from Frederiksted to Christiansted is available. The shuttle service is \$12 per person and it runs every 25 minutes. Purchase your roundtrip ticket at the St. Croix Taxi Federation Booth located in the parking lot on the pier. Independent taxis are also available for any other venues.

HOW TO GET TO TOWN

Frederiksted is immediately adjacent to the pier. The capital, Christiansted, is 30 minutes away. When departing the taxi to Christiansted, you will be located near Alexander Hamilton House and Government House. Excellent shopping will be on that street and towards the water (main shopping area). Kings Alley is off the boardwalk

SHOPPING

Strolling the historic and quaint streets of Christiansted is a delightful experience. Besides the full array of duty-free items available, "Cruzan" jewelry and crafts are a specialty. Look for Caribbean bracelets, Larimar, treasure and coin jewelry.

Most shops in Christiansted will be open while the ship is in port. There is limited shopping in Frederiksted.
